This inquiry focuses on how economics can move away from the reduction that it solely uses a mathematical approach and does not question its assumptions seriously. This concern is approached from the perspective of Martin Heidegger's *The Question Concerning Technology*. The key insight gained from Heidegger is that economics is lost if it does not move towards a self-conscious polyphonic economics. Polyphonic is to move away from one-dimensional thinking by being open to many voices and, therefore, including other fields of economic thought outside mainstream economic thinking. Furthermore, self-consciousness is primarily the thorough questioning, watching over, and becoming aware of the assumptions and essence of economics.
